2005-2006 TERM

- 1) The quorum for the Committee shall be seven (7) members.
- 2) The Committee shall convene, recess, and adjourn upon the order of the Chairperson.
- 3) The Chairperson shall determine measures to be considered and the order in which such measures are considered.
- 4) The Rules of the Senate shall prevail in all matters not covered by these Committee Rules.
- 5) These Committee Rules may be amended upon motion duly made and seconded and subsequently approved by two thirds (2/3) of the members of the Committee provided that written notice has been given twenty four (24) hours prior to the Committee meeting.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman at 3:04 p.m.

Senator Hudgens, 47th started the meeting by speaking on [SB 386](#); This bill is relating to apportionment of the House of Representatives and Senate and qualifications of members, so as to provide for the composition of state senatorial districts and, in particular, Senate Districts 46, 47, and 49.
