Rules

2009-2010 Term

1. These Committee Rules of Operation shall be consistent with Senate Rule 2-1.5 (d) regarding the establishment of Rules of Operation.
2. Quorum of the Committee shall be four (4) members.
3. The Chairman shall determine which bills and resolutions are to be considered and the order in which said measures are considered.
4. The Chairman shall have the authority to refer bills and resolutions to subcommittees for study. Such subcommittees in turn shall have the authority to make recommendations on such measures to the full committee at such time as shall be designated by the Chairman.
5. The Committee shall convene, recess, and adjourn upon the order of the Chairman.
6. Any member or members of the Committee who disagree with the majority report of the Committee shall be privileged to file a minority report in writing, setting forth succinctly the reasons for their dissent.
7. These rules may be amended upon a motion duly made and subsequently approved by a quorum of the Committee in a meeting called by the Chairman.
8. A bill, resolution, or other matter will be considered only after presentation by its principal author or a legislator whom he designates to do so. In the event that more than one member of the General Assembly has signed a measure, the principal author shall be the one whose name appeared first in the list of authors.
9. The Chairman reserves the right to delay action on substitutes and amendments not provided to the Chairman at least 24 hours prior to the hearing.
10. Where these rules are silent on a specific issue, the Rules of the Senate, as adopted, shall govern. (Senate Rule 2-1.5 {d})

SB 50 (Hudgens, 47th) Insurance; contracting entities; prohibit access to provider's health care

Sen. Hudgens, 47th presented the bill placing specific conditions regarding transparency and disclosure on provider network contracts when such networks allow contracting third parties access to the network. Dr. Robert Howell an Orthopedic Surgeon explained his point of view and that he felt the bill was not transparent enough and they would like the ability to say no on the physician's part. Several others spoke against the bill. Donald Palmisano from MAG, Faye Scott from Resurgens, Ethan James from GA Hospital Association, Martha Phillip with the GA Dental Association and Ron Jackson with the GA Insurance Commissioners office were in support of the bill. Graham Thompson with the GA Association of Health Plans, Stacey Freeman with the American Health Insurance Plans, and Joe Fleming with the Georgia Chamber all were in opposition to the bill. Senator Wiles moved **SB 50 do pass by substitute** and Senator Murphy seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous.

HB 417 (Rep. Neal, 1st) Insurance; dispute; material not in English; provisions

Representative Neal, 1st, presented this bill. The legislation provides that in the event of a dispute or complaint wherein an insurer provided any material in a language other than English, the English language version of the policy will control the resolution of the dispute or complaint. Senator Harbison asked for clarification. Senator Shafer moved **HB 417 do pass** and Senator Harbison seconded the motion. The bill passed unanimously. Senator Wiles will carry this bill in the Senate.

HB 417 DO PASS

SB 316 (Thomas, 54th) Medicare supplemental; make available to persons under age 65 who qualify for medicare due to disability or end-stage renal disease

Senator Don Thomas presented the bill. This legislation requires insurers offering Medicare supplement policies to persons who are eligible for and enrolled in Medicare by reason of disability or end-stage renal disease regardless of age. Anthony Hoyle gave a brief statement regarding kidney disease and the process he has gone through not having access to Medicare and urged the committee to support the bill. Brian Looby from MAG, Matt Bassett from Davita, Inc., Michael Shelnett and Stacy Freeman with America's Health Insurance Plans spoke in favor of the bill. Senator Harbison moved **SB 316 do pass by substitute** and Senator Chapman seconded the motion. The bill passed unanimously.

SB 316 DO PASS BY SUBSTITUTE

[SB 317](#) (Hill, 32nd) Health; no law shall compel any person to participate in any healthcare & [SR 794](#) (Hill, 32nd) Health Care Freedom of Choice Constitutional Amendment

Senator Judson Hill presented the companion bill and resolution that prohibits any law, rule or regulation from compelling any person, employer, or health care provider to participate in any health care system and not to limit a person's option for the purchase of private health insurance. Penny Shelton spoke on behalf of the Georgia Tea Party citing they could opt out and not be penalized to preserve the freedom to choose. Senator Hawkins moved **SB 317 do pass** and Senator Wiles seconded the motion. Senator Harbison voted no and the remainder voted do pass. Senator Chapman moved **SR 794 do pass** and Senator Rogers seconded the motion. Senator Harbison voted no and the remainder voted do pass.

SB 310 (Hawkins, 49th) Insurance; pharmacy benefits managers; regulation and licensure

SB 411 (Hudgens, 47th) “Healthy Georgians Act of 2010”

Senator Hudgens gave a brief explanation of the bill then turned it over to Michael Shelnett, with Humana, for a more complete explanation. The legislation allows individual and group health plans to include and operate wellness programs. Ron Jackson with Department of Insurance and Stacey Freeman with American Health Insurance support the bill. Mark Mixer with Alliant Healthcare Insurance more fully described the product and how it works and then took questions from the committee. Senator Shafer moved **SB 411 do pass by substitute** and Senator Murphy seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous.

SB 411 DO PASS BY SUBSTITUTE

SB 330 (Smith, 52nd) Insurance; prohibit insurers from rescinding/canceling policies

Senator Smith presented the bill. This legislation requires group and blanket health insurance policies to provide coverage for dependent children up to and including the age of 25. It also prohibits them from implementing a maximum lifetime benefit limit and from rescinding or cancelling a policy, or denying a claim because of a misstatement or omission unless it directly relates to the illness or condition which produced the claim. Kyle Pinion and Danny Orrock spoke in favor of the bill while Graham Thompson spoke against it. Senator Davis moved **SB 330 do pass by substitute** and Senator Wiles seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous.

SB 330 DO PASS BY SUBSTITUTE

SB 407 (Hill, 32nd) Insurance; authorize insurers to offer individual medical/surgical health

Senator Judson Hill presented the legislation on approved out-of-state health plans offered in Georgia. Dr. Ron Bachman spoke in favor of the bill while several others spoke against the bill. Senator Wiles made a motion **SB 407 do pass by substitute** and Senator Rogers seconded the motion.

HB 128 (Rep. Benton, 31st) Disabled veterans and blind persons; eligibility certificate; provisions

Senator Hudgens explained that the legislation places a ten-year limit on certificates of eligibility for persons exempted from payment of occupation taxes, administrative fees, or regulatory fees for peddling, conducting a business, or practicing a profession or semi-profession. Current law provides for no such time limit. Senator Rogers moved **HB 128 do pass** and Senator Wiles seconded the motion. The bill passed unanimously. Senator Hudgens will carry this bill in the Senate.

HB 128 DO PASS

SR 108 (Johnson, 1st) Election; right of secret ballot

Senator Wiles presented the bill. This resolution proposes an amendment to the Constitution where local, state or federal law requires elections for public office or public votes on initiatives or referenda, or designations or authorizations of employee representation, the right of individuals to vote by secret ballot will be guaranteed. Senator Wiles moved **SR 108 do pass** and Senator Judson Hill seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous.

SB 482 (Hudgens, 47th) Insurance; life settlements; revise certain definitions

Representative Knox, 24th and Senator Carter, 1st presented the bill together explaining the legislation allows individuals who have lost group health coverage due to a job loss to continue coverage under the provisions of the federal Stimulus Act. Specifically, the legislation extends COBRA coverage for 15 additional months and also provides a 65 percent federal government subsidy toward COBRA coverage to employees who are involuntarily terminated between September 1, 2008 and February 28, 2010 as well as their family members who are eligible for COBRA due to such termination. An amendment was offered. Senator Shafer moved to adopt the amendment and Senator Davis seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous. Senator Rogers moved **HB 1268 do pass by substitute** and Senator Davis seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous.
