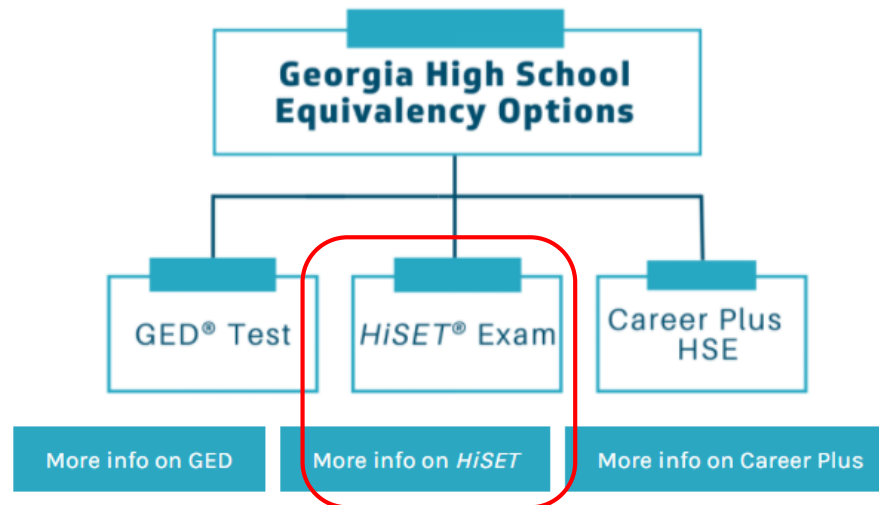

Georgia High School Equivalency (GED) Program

Welcome to the home of the official Georgia High School Equivalency Program (GaHSE, formerly the GED Testing Program) where you can find everything you need to know about choosing a high school equivalency pathway, taking your tests or enrolling in classes, and earning your high school equivalency diploma. The Technical College System of Georgia (TCSG) now offers multiple options for achieving your high school equivalency. Two computer-based testing (CBT) pathways are available through testing centers or proctored at home: the GED® test or the *HiSET*® exam. **The *HiSET*® exam will be available this fall.** TCSG is also piloting a workforce-based solution to a high school equivalency through joint enrollment called Career Plus HSE.

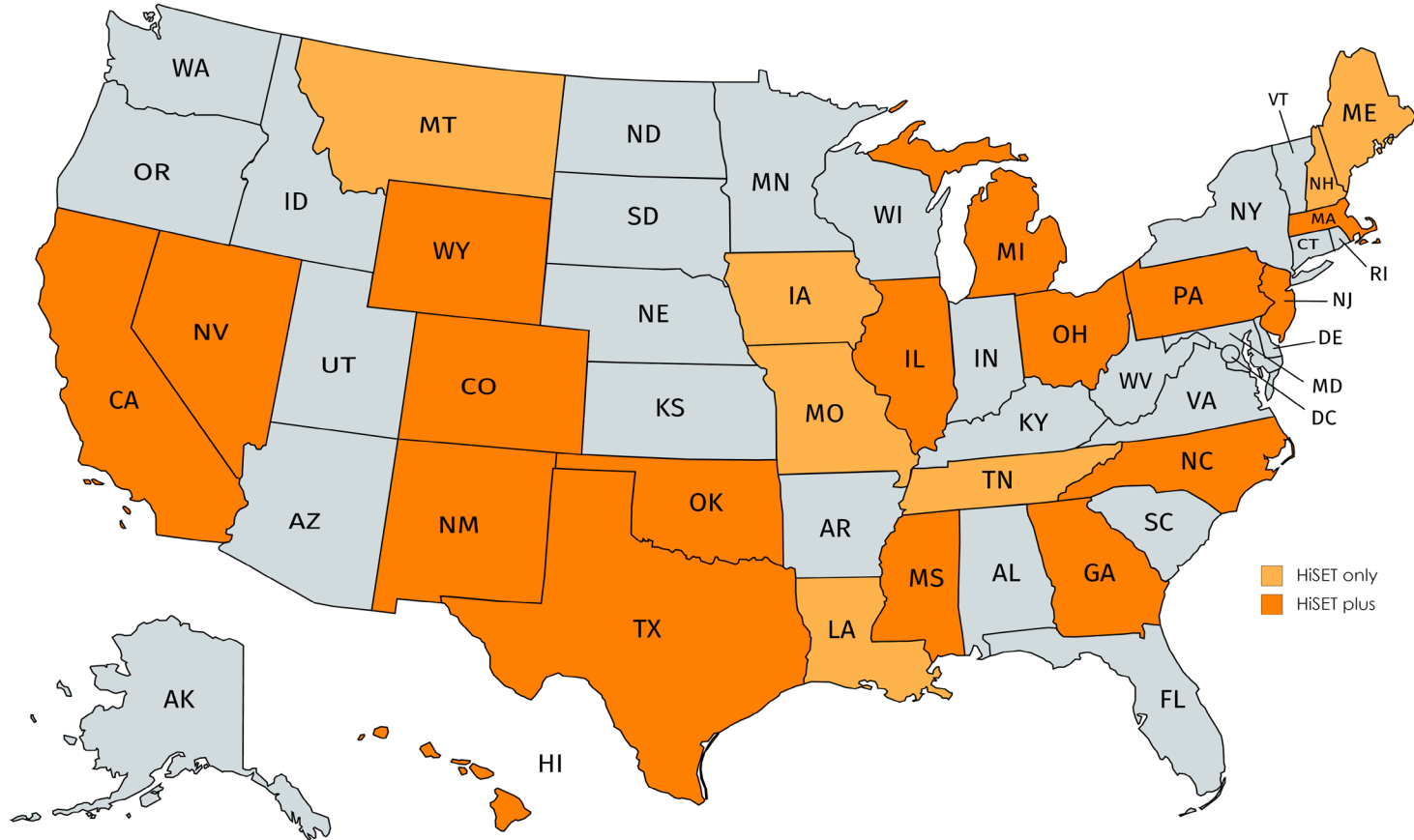



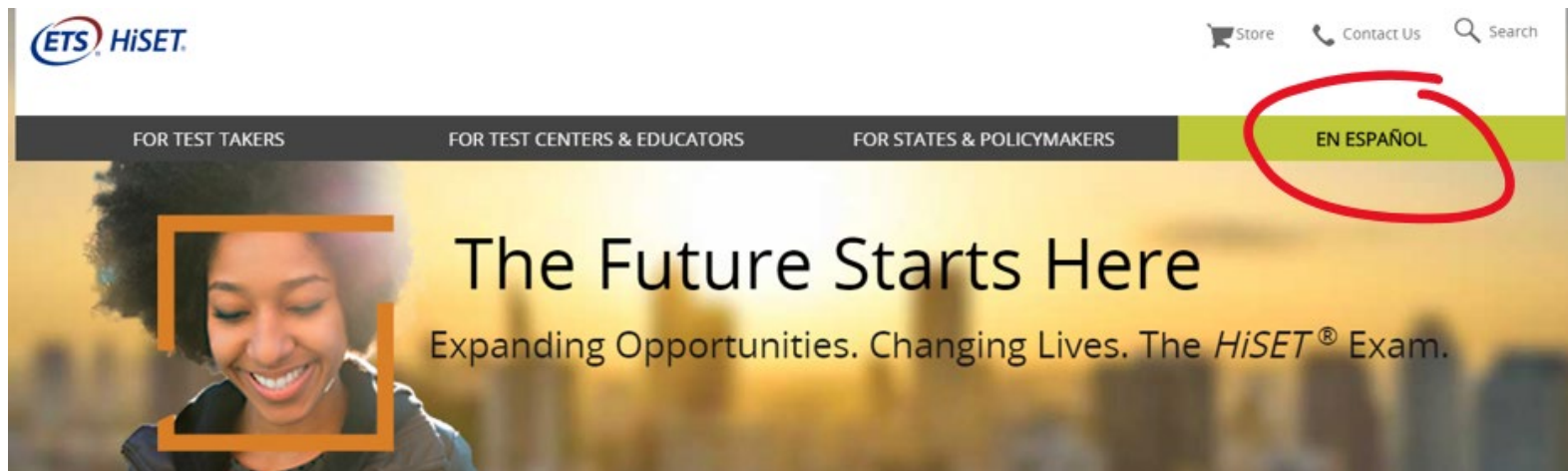

HiSET[®] Exam at Home

To meet the needs of test takers who can't test at a test center because of public health concerns, ETS is offering the *HiSET*[®] exam at home option. With the at home option, you can take any of the five subtests that make up the HiSET exam on your own computer at home or in another secure location.

Each subtest delivered at home has the same content, format and on-screen experience as the test you would take at a test center. Your at home appointment will be monitored by a human proctor online through ProctorU[®].

Currently, at home appointments are available **15 hours a day, seven days a week**.

When is HiSET Exam at Home Available?

- Test sessions is available **15 hours a day, seven days a week**
- Tests are available in **English and Spanish** (per state rules)
- HiSET Exam at Home is **currently available in most states** that have adopted the HiSET exam
 - Available as an option as long as states approve its use
- HiSET at Home testing **started mid-June 2020**
 - More than 9,000 test registrations so far

Important Facts

- Testing takes place through **test takers' personal computers at home or another secure location**
 - Only available at home via **CBT**
- Testing is **not supported on tablets or mobile phones**
- Test sessions are **monitored in real-time** through the use of human proctors and artificial intelligence technology
- The entire test session will be **recorded on video**
- There is a **test fee center of \$17.50 per subtest**
 - The HiSET test fee and state administration fee (if applicable) remain the same

What Are the Eligibility Requirements?

- The test taker must be **18 years of age or have an approved age waiver**
- The test taker meet the [HiSET state requirements](#)
- Computer meets the [equipment requirements](#) for the test including the installation of the ETS Test Browser and the ProctorU Systems Check
 - The test taker must use a link we provide to check prior to registration
- The test room meets the requirements for an **acceptable testing environment**

HiSET Exam At Home Preparation Checklist

1 Equipment and Environment Requirements

Make sure your computer and testing room meet these requirements before you register.



2 Start Your Registration with ETS

Log in, select the Test At Home option and pay for your subtest.



3 Complete Your Registration with ProctorU

From the email link, choose a test date and time, and complete your registration.



4 The Testing Experience

Learn about testing procedures and what to expect when you take the test.



5 After the Test

Receive your scores and learn about retesting if needed.

Equipment Requirements

- **Computer:** Desktop/laptop with Windows® operating system version 10, 8 or 7, or a Mac® computer with Mac OS X 10.5 or higher (10.13 High Sierra recommended)
- **Browser:** Chrome™ or Firefox® browser
- **Install and run the ETS Test Browser.** Windows or Mac version
- **Speaker:** internal or external; not part of a headset
- **Microphone:** internal or external; not part of a headset
- **Camera:** internal or external, to show a 360-degree view of room
- **Complete the ProctorU® Systems Check** from the computer you'll use to test

Environment Requirements

- **Testing Area:** a private space, free of people and distractions
 - Food and drink are not permitted during the test
 - No testing in public places
- **Seating:** a cleared desk or tabletop surface for the computer, with a standard chair (no bed, couch or overstuffed chair)
- **Note-taking materials:** small desktop whiteboard or paper with transparent sheet protector and a dry erase marker

Reminders for Test Takers on Test Day

- **Dress appropriately** — make sure the proctor can see your ears and face throughout the test; don't wear jewelry or other accessories
- **Clear your computer area** of all items not approved for use during your test
- **Have your ID ready** to show the proctor
- **Log in to your ProctorU account** at your appointment time to start your session
- **Complete the check-in steps** with the proctor
- **Launch the ETS Test Browser** when the proctor tells you to
 - The proctor will give you the password to access the test

HiSET Exam at Home Registration

- The test taker must meet the **Georgia HiSET state requirements** for HSE candidates.
- **There are no prerequisites to qualify for the HiSET Exam at Home option**
 - No need to wait for an invitation to take the HiSET Exam at Home
- **Test takers register for the HiSET Exam at Home through their ETS HiSET Account** — register and pay for all HiSET Exam at Home subtests
 - Same retesting policies apply for the HiSET Exam at Home
 - Available retest credits apply
 - The \$17.50 at home test center fee will apply to each subtest



HiSET CBT Exam Fee: (state fee \$8 and center fee \$8 are included)

- Full Battery \$133.75
- Initial subject area tests \$26.75 each
- Two retest per subject area \$16 each

HiSET Exam at Home Fee: (state fee \$8 and remote center fee \$17.50 are included)

- Fee: Full Battery \$181.25
- Initial subject area tests \$36.25 each
- Two retest per subject area \$25.50 each

HiSET Test Fee Methods of Payment

Methods of Payment

- debit card or credit card
- PayPal® (online payment only)
- HiSET Test Voucher
- Cash options include PayPal Cash® or VISA/MasterCard/American Express gift card
- If paying at the test center, payment policies vary

HiSET Retest Fees, No Shows or Cancellations

HiSET Retest Credits and Fees

- Up to two retest attempts are included in subtest fee
 - If taken within 12 months of the date of purchase
 - Only applicable to the same subtest and delivery mode
 - If delivery mode is changed, the price difference must be paid or will be refunded
- State administration and test center fees may apply

HiSET No Shows or Cancellations

- Test taker must pay test center fee if they no show or cancel their testing appointment before the cancellation deadline
- Test takers forfeit one attempt if they no show their scheduled appointment

HiSET Fee Vouchers

- State agencies or organizations can purchase HiSET vouchers to cover HiSET testing fees on behalf of the test taker
 - Vouchers can cover test fees, state administrative fees and/or test center fees
 - If a test taker is a “no show” or cancels, the voucher is considered used
 - Voucher administrative fee may apply

 - Application is available in the HiSET Test Taker Bulletin or at https://hiset.ets.org/s/pdf/accommodations_request_form.pdf
 - Applications may take time to review and approve – candidates are encouraged to apply early
 - ETS Disability Services may need more documentation before approval

HiSET Scoring Levels

High School Equivalent (HSE) Score

- Minimum scaled score 8 of 20 on each subtest
- Minimum score of 2 on the essay
- Combined scaled score of 45 on entire battery


College and Career Readiness (CCR) Score

- Minimum of scaled score 15 of 20 on each subtest
- Minimum score of 4 on essay
- Performance level indicative of college entry into credit bearing courses

Highest Possible Scores

- 20 on each subtest
- 100 for entire battery

HiSET® – Test at a Glance (TAAG) Information Brief – 2020

The purpose of the ETS High School Equivalency Test (HiSET®) is to certify a candidate's attainment of academic knowledge and skills equivalent to those of a high school graduate. HiSET scores will identify those candidates who have performed at a level consistent with high school equivalency. Information from the HiSET program also will help identify areas in which candidates are career and college ready, as well as areas in which additional preparation may be needed.

Candidates will be tested in five core areas: Language Arts – Reading, Language Arts – Writing, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies. Descriptions of each of these five tests are contained in this document. The **HiSET® Practice Tests** allow candidates to view sample content and item types and provide them with general information about their level of preparation for taking the operational form.

Through ongoing validity research, the HiSET program has been connected to college-readiness indicators. Candidate performance relative to these indicators is part of the reporting system for the assessment.



Relating the choice of measures of center and variability to the shape of the data distribution and the context in which the data were gathered.
7.EE.2	Understand that rewriting an expression in different forms in a problem context can shed light on the problem and how the quantities in it are related. For example, $a + 0.05a = 1.05a$ means that “increase by 5%” is the same as “multiply by 1.05.”
7.EE.3	Solve multi-step, real-life and mathematical problems posed with positive and negative rational numbers in any form (whole numbers, fractions, and decimals), using tools strategically. Apply properties of operations to calculate with numbers in any form; convert between forms as appropriate; and assess the reasonableness of answers using mental computation and estimation strategies. For example: If a woman making \$25 an hour gets a 10% raise, she will make an additional $\frac{1}{10}$ of her salary an hour, or \$2.50, for a new salary of \$27.50. If you want to place a towel bar $9\frac{3}{4}$ inches long in the center of a door that is $27\frac{1}{2}$ inches wide, you will need to place the bar about 9 inches from each edge; this estimate can be used as a check on the exact computation.


1. Use properties of operations with real numbers, including rational and irrational numbers (e.g., identify rational and irrational numbers, locate these numbers between two points on a number line, find the product and sum of rational and irrational numbers, and determine if the product or sum is rational or irrational).
2. Rewrite expressions involving radicals and rational exponents using the properties of exponents (e.g., find an equivalent expression to the cube root of $27x^3y^6$).

- Most states or local governments have issued stay-at-home or social distancing directives
- These directives impact:
 - Closures of schools, non-essential businesses and large gatherings
 - How you get groceries and supplies
 - Access to educational programs, resources, testing and libraries

- Test takers may cancel or postpone test appointments free of charge

Test Center and Adult Ed Program Recommendations for a Safe Environment

- Establish regular cleaning schedules of high-touch surfaces
- Provide test takers with disposable wipes to clean testing equipment before use
- Increase ventilation — open windows or adjust air conditioning
- Limit the number of clients
