The Senate Judiciary Non-Civil Committee will meet on Wednesday, March 12, 2014 at 3:00 p.m. in 307 CLOB.

**Agenda:**

- HB 773 – Rep. Dickey, 140<sup>th</sup> – Changing provisions relating to discharging a gun or pistol near a public highway or street.
- HB 940 – Rep. Willard, 51<sup>st</sup> – Providing for an additional judge of the Chattahoochee Judicial Circuit and Oconee Judicial Circuit.
- HB 749 – Rep. Duncan, 26<sup>th</sup> – Providing for the crime of cargo theft.
- HB 804 – Rep. Lindsey, 54<sup>th</sup> – Relating to the testimony of a child ten years old or younger by closed circuit television and persons entitled to be present; to provide for the testimony of individuals under 18 years of age outside the physical presence of an accused in criminal proceedings under certain circumstances.
- HB 837 – Hamilton, 24<sup>th</sup> – Relating to agreements for probation services, so as to provide for the supervision of misdemeanor and county and city ordinance offenders by county and municipal probation officers and private probation services providers; to provide for the revocation, modification, and tolling of sentences under certain circumstances by county and municipal courts; to provide for the conditions of probation; to provide for the assessment and collection of costs of probation; to provide for related matters.
- HB 870 – Rep. Tanner, 9<sup>th</sup> – Relating to the Brain and Spinal Injury Trust Fund and the imposition of an additional fine for reckless driving.

- HR 1183 – Rep. Tanner, 9<sup>th</sup> – Proposing a Constitutional amendment to provide the General Assembly may impose additional penalties or fees for the offense of reckless driving and may provide for the allocation of such additional penalties or fees to the Brain and Spinal Injury Trust Fund.
- HB 1078 – Rep. Kelley, 16<sup>th</sup> – A bill to clarify provisions relating to juries, revise definitions, change provisions relating to choosing grand jurors; to provide for concurrent grand juries; to provide for a preliminary oath to be administered to grand juries; to change provisions relating to when there are insufficient persons to complete a panel of grand jurors.
- HR 1161 – Rep. Caldwell, 131<sup>st</sup> – Proposing a Constitutional amendment so as to increase from three years to seven years the time for which a district attorney shall have been an active-status member of the State Bar of Georgia.
