Program Overview

Summary of Activities: The Georgia State-wide Business Court was established to provide an outlet for complex business related litigation to both accelerate the outcome of those cases as well as relieve the burden of hearing those cases from Superior Court Judges. A list of some of the types of cases that will fall under the jurisdiction of the State-wide Business Court include: cases involving the Georgia Trade Secrets Act of 1990, the Georgia Arbitration Code, and the Georgia Uniform Securities Act of 2008. Cases will only be accepted when the amount of damages in controversy is \$1 million involving commercial real property, and \$500,000 for cases not involving commercial real property. The Court will have a \$3,000 filing fee that will be remitted to Treasury.

Location: HB239 (2019 Session) states that the Georgia State-wide Business Court shall sit at the seat of government in Atlanta or shall sit in Macon-Bibb County.

Noteworthy: HR993 (2018 Session) amended the Constitution to create the Georgia State-wide Business Court, and HB239 (2019 Session), provided the enabling legislation. The first Judge was appointed on August 1, 2019 and the Court will begin accepting cases on August 1, 2020.

Summary of Activities: The Supreme Court is the State's highest court and is responsible for reviewing decisions made by all other state courts in both civil and criminal cases. In order to establish and maintain a coherent and consistent body of authoritative decisional law for the benefit of the bench, the bar, and the public, the Supreme Court conducts monthly oral argument sessions and issues rulings by published opinions on complex questions involving the constitutionality of state statutes, all criminal appeals in capital cases, all equity and extraordinary remedies cases involving death sentences, all habeas corpus cases, and petitions for review of decisions of the Court of Appeals. A constitutional limitation requires the Supreme Court to decide appeals within two court terms. In addition to opinions, the Supreme Court issues final orders on hundreds of petitions for review filed each year. The Supreme Court also bears administrative and regulatory responsibilities including regulating admission to the bar, establishing the uniform rules of practice and procedure for all classes of courts, regulating the practice of law, and chairing the Judicial Council.

Timing: Opinions deciding appeals are published an average of twice per month. Orders on petitions for review and on other matters are issued on a daily basis.

Noteworthy: The Supreme Court began conducting their business from the Nathan Deal Judicial Center on December 10, 2019.

Summary of Activities: The Medicaid Fraud Control Unit (MFCU) program is responsible for investigation and prosecution of fraudulent or illegal acts in connection with any aspect of the provision of medical assistance or health care services funded through joint federal-state programs, or the recovery of federal and state health care funds gained through fraudulent, abusive or illegal acts by healthcare providers and others. This includes investigating complaints of abuse or neglect of patients in facilities that receive Medicaid funds.

Fund Sources: MFCU has a federal funds match that is 25/75. Currently, the federal funds are not being matched at the full amount with state funds, resulting in the program losing out on available federal dollars. The state is required to operate an effective MFCU in order to receive full federal participation in the funding of the Medicaid program.

The Central Office provides the direct administrative support for the system, along with the administration of the State-Level Services division and agency training programs. In addition, this program includes two client representation components. The first component is the Georgia Capital Defender division (O.C.G.A. 17-12-12), which is responsible for the direct and co-counsel representation, assistance, and resources in death penalty cases and appeals. The second component is the Office of the Mental Health Advocate (O.C.G.A. 17-12-11), which provides services to attorneys representing criminal defendants with mental health challenges, as well as direct representation for NGRI (not guilty by reason of insanity) and IST (incompetent to stand trial) cases.
