

Senator John D. Bulloch Senate District 11



John D. Bulloch, Jr., a Republican, was first elected to the Georgia Senate representing the 11th District in 2002. Prior to his seat in the Senate, Sen. Bulloch served in the House of Representatives, elected in 1998. Sen. Bulloch represents the citizens of Colquitt, Decatur, Early, Grady, Miller, and Seminole counties. He also represents part of Mitchell and Thomas counties.

Sen. Bulloch serves as chairman of the Agriculture and Consumer Affairs Committee and as vice chairman of the Natural Resources and the Environment Committee. He is also a member of the Appropriations and Rules committees

and is an ex-officio member of the Banking and Financial Institutions Committee.

Sen. Bulloch attended elementary and secondary school in the Thomas County School district. He then studied for two years at Abraham Baldwin College in Tifton, majoring in agriculture.

Sen. Bulloch is a successful fourth generation farmer born in Thomas County. He is the son of the late J. Douglas Bulloch of Ochlocknee and Katherine B. Prevatte of Thomasville. He owns Bulloch Farms, where he grows and harvests pecans and row crops.

Sen. Bulloch is a member of the First Baptist Church of Thomasville. He has served as chairman of the Thomas County Board of Commissioners for 14 years and has been a member for 20 years.

Sen. Bulloch is married to the former Miriam Garner of Thomas County and they have three daughters, Dee, Joni and Ashley, and grandchildren Marx, Sara Kathryn and Graham.
