Senator Jen Jordan, a Democrat, was elected to the senate in a special election in 2017. She represents Georgia's 6th Senate District, which includes portions of Cobb and Fulton Counties.

From kindergarten to law school, Sen. Jordan is a product of Georgia's public education system. Sen. Jordan obtained her bachelor's degree from Georgia Southern University. She then went on to graduate *magna cum laude* from the University of Georgia School of Law where she was a member of the Georgia Law Review and of the school's award winning National Moot Court Team. After graduating, Sen. Jordan served as a federal law clerk to United States District Court Judge Anthony A. Alaimo. She is the past-President of the University of Georgia's Law School Association Council and a master with the Joseph Henry Lumpkin Inn of Court.

Sen. Jordan was named to Georgia Trend Magazine's "40 Under 40" list that recognizes Georgia's leaders in "commercial, cultural, academic and governmental institutions" under the age of 40.

In 2013, Sen. Jordan was recognized by the University of Georgia as one of its "40 Under 40" alumni who "have made an impact in business, leadership, community, educational and/or philanthropic endeavors." Additionally, in 2014, because of her legal work, she was recognized as one of the "40 Under 40: Rising Stars" by the Fulton County Daily Report.

She is a member of the Leadership Georgia Class of 2008 and serves on the Board of Governors for the State Bar of Georgia.

Although a native of South Georgia, Sen. Jordan has lived in the Atlanta-area since moving here to begin her law practice. She lives with her husband, Lawton, and their two children, Lawton and Cokie.
