Senator Chip Rogers was raised in Cobb County. He earned his Bachelor of Science Degree with a certificate in Economics from Georgia Tech and his Masters of Business Administration from Georgia State University.

Chip was first elected to the Georgia House of Representatives in 2002 and to the Georgia Senate in 2004. Since that time, he has earned the nickname of "Taxpayer Champion" for his tireless work on cutting taxes, reducing spending, promoting pro-business legislation, and bringing transparency and efficiency to government.

Senator Rogers has a well-deserved reputation of taking on tough issues. Some of his more notable bills have addressed Illegal Immigration, Dog Fighting, and a Constitutional Limit of government spending. For his legislative efforts he has received both State and National recognition.

In November of 2008, Senator Rogers was unanimously elected Majority Leader of the Georgia Senate. He also serves on the following committees: Finance, Banking and Financial Institutions, Economic Development, Insurance and Labor, Redistricting, Rules, Appropriations, and Assignments.

Senator Rogers is self-employed, with business involvement in residential real estate and broadcasting. He is married to Amy. They have four children, Emma, Quinn, Reagan and Sarah. The Rogers are active members of First Baptist Church of Woodstock.
