"This week, the Georgia State Senate continued our work in earnest. A total of 91 Senate bills have been introduced and referred to committee. Most of our committees have held organizational meetings, adopted rules and created subcommittees. Significantly, we have agreed with the House on a legislative calendar through March 5 (Day 29) which will allow us to more effectively plan our work and ensure that legislation is carefully considered and fully deliberated."

Non-Partisan Elections

On January 29, the Senate passed Senate Bills 25-32 (omit 28), sponsored by Sen. Cecil Staton (R-Macon), by a vote of 34-15. If approved by both chambers, the bill will establish non-partisan municipal elections for the Macon-Bibb consolidated government, including the elected offices of the mayor, county coroner, probate judge, school board, board of commissioners, the Macon-Bibb County Water and Sewage Authority and the local board of education.
