

### Georgia Preceptor Tax Incentive Program (PTIP):

Tax deductions of up to \$10,000 for uncompensated community-based faculty physicians who provide training to medical, physician assistant, and nurse practitioner students.

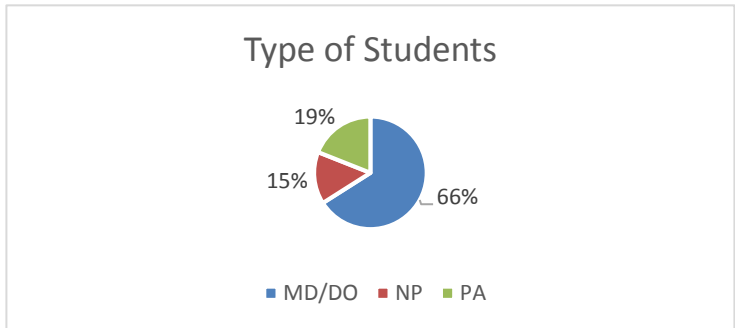
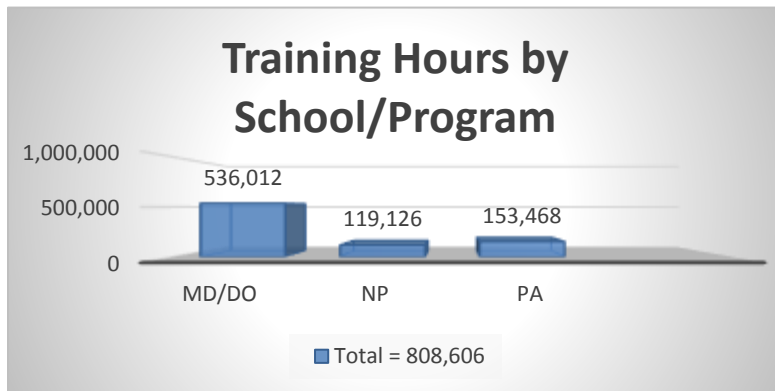
**PRECEPTORS:** Georgia physicians who provide clinical training to health professions students for a minimum of three (to a maximum of 10) rotations, and who are not compensated through any other source, can claim a tax deduction of \$1,000 for every 160 hours of training provided.

**PROGRAMS:** Students must be enrolled in one of the state's public or private medical/osteopathic, physician assistant, or nurse practitioner programs. Georgia's public and private colleges and universities must be able to utilize the full cadre of Georgia community-based physicians in order to educate the students matriculating in Georgia programs.

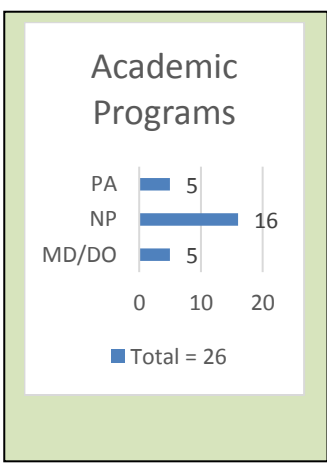
**STUDENTS:** Enrolled in a Georgia Medical, PA or NP Program.

- Pediatrics
- OB/GYN
- Psychiatry
- Emergency Medicine
- General Surgery



**\$1,998,000** in deductions have been certified by the Statewide AHEC for 2016.

The tax deduction provides a reward to the community-based physician for these valuable community resources.
