The Dual Enrollment Program is funded by State General Funds.

Program pays full course tuition at public institutions and pays a fixed rate at private institutions.

House Bill 444 (2020) revised the program with:

- Course type limitations
- Grade level limitations
- College semester hour limitations



Course Type Limitations:

- Core subject areas:
 - English
 - Mathematics
 - Science
 - Social Studies
 - Foreign Language
- Career, Technical, and Agricultural Education Courses
 - Courses must be aligned with GaDOE Career Clusters & Pathways



Grade Level Limitations:

- All 11th and 12th grade students Core and CTAE courses
- 10th grade students enrolled in CTAE courses at TCSG
- 10th grade students with qualifying ACT or SAT test scores
- 10th grade students pursuing an Accelerated Career Diploma




College Semester Hours Limitations:

- 30 semester hours cap
- Students may not retake courses
- Students limited to two course withdrawals to remain eligible for the program


Students may take dual enrollment courses at their own expense




Dual Enrollment Student Counts




Fiscal Year Funding by Institution Type



Student Enrollment by Institution Type




Dual Enrollment Attendance by Delivery Location






Dual Enrollment Students by Grade Level






Class of 2022 Advanced Coursework Statistics

Advanced Coursework 2022 Graduates by Course Type





2022 Graduation Cohort - Average HOPE GPA

HOPE/Zell Miller Grant and Dual Enrollment

- Senate Bill 86 Signed into law in May 2023
- <u>Public</u> High school students (10 12 grade) who meet HOPE Grant eligibility requirements may use HOPE Grant before reaching the Dual Enrollment Funding Cap, for programs on the HOPE Career Grant list.
- Must enroll in approved CTAE courses as listed on the DE Directory at a TCSG College, from programs listed on the HOPE Career Grant List.
- Both High School and TCSG institution must advise the student:
 - HOPE & Zell Miller Grant Paid Hours:
 Limit of 63 semester hours, and
 - HOPE & Zell Miller Scholarship & Grant Combined Paid Hours:
 <u>Limit of 127 semester hours</u>



HOPE/Zell Miller Grant and Dual Enrollment

- Students must meet HOPE Grant requirements:
 - Must meet Georgia residency (one year in Georgia), US citizen or eligible noncitizen and academic Grant eligibility requirements
 - Male students 18 years of age must be registered with Federal Selective Service
- Students must complete a Dual Enrollment application for the term of enrollment
- The Post Secondary Institution determines the eligibility for HOPE Grant, Zell Miller Grant and HOPE Career Grant



HOPE Grant Program Regulations

2023-2024 Academic Year Awards

- HOPE Grant and Zell Miller Grant awards at TCSG
 - Equal to standard tuition rate per semester hour
 - Must be applied to tuition
 - Does not pay for fees or required books and supplies
- HOPE Career Grant standard award is based on program of study and enrollment hours
 - 1-2 hours = \$125 per term
 - 3-8 hours = \$250 per term
 - 9 or more hours = \$500 per term
 - Award may be applied to tuition, fees, or books

HOPE Grant Program Regulations

HOPE Grant, Zell Miller Grant - Academic Requirements

- HOPE Grant Maintain at least a calculated 2.0 GPA of paid courses while receiving Grant funds
- Zell Miller Grant Earn a minimum calculated 3.5 GPA of paid courses while receiving Grant funds
 - GPA checked after each term End of Term Checkpoint
 - Students that lose Zell Miller Grant at the End of Term Checkpoint, may regain it with the required minimum 3.5 cumulative GPA at the end of the next term
- Maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress as defined by the PSI
